# **Biography**

Jonathan Palmer Webster (sometimes called "Dr.") was a New Englander and a practitioner in spreading the popular fame of mesmerism, now called hypnotism. He was interested in its medical aspects. Webster gave many public lectures and demonstrated experiments on mesmerism along the Eastern seaboard. He also taught courses in this subject. His other interests, pursued prior to his involvement in mesmerism, were phrenology and penmanship, for which he also taught courses.

# **Scope and Content**

Most of the Webster collection dates from the 1840's when he was actively engaged in presenting lectures and demonstrations on mesmerism. Manuscript material includes his writings on mesmerism and phrenology, prospectuses with names of subscribers to the courses and record of payment, testimonials signed by participants in his courses, and a record book indicating places Webster practiced phrenology, amount of money received, and names of some individuals examined. There is also some material relating to his career as an instructor of calligraphy, such as examples of his penmanship style.

Printed and published material encompasses broadsides and some posters announcing lectures on mesmerism, with a few on phrenology, including demonstrations of painless dentistry. Most of the broadsides advertise Webster's presentations. Some announce other practitioners, Dr. Boynton and Louis De Bonneville. The collection includes a scrapbook of news clippings about his courses on mesmerism, in addition to publications about various aspects of mesmerism, magnetism, and phrenology. He wrote one himself, entitled "A Treatise on Phrenology." These publications date from 1824-1849, with the majority from the 1840's. The collection also includes a cigar case with a portrait presumably of a figure in the history of mesmerism.
